Do You Know a Lucky Dog?

Texas author and pet columnist Cathy M. Rosenthal delivers a heartwarming tale to show young readers how to love and care for their pets

What does a dog need to be happy and healthy?

“Dogs need much more than food and an occasional pat on the head,” says Cathy M. Rosenthal, author of *The Lucky Tale of Two Dogs*.

“They need to belong to a family that loves and cares about their entire well-being.”

In *The Lucky Tale of Two Dogs* (ages 4-8, Pet Pundit Publishing) Rosenthal traces the lives of two dogs who happen to live “in the very same town, on the very same street, in two different houses,”

but who share very different lives with their respective families. The lucky dog has lots of daily interaction with his family, from spending time and playing together to taking daily walks around the neighborhood. Sadly, the unlucky dog spends most of his time alone in the backyard “rarely hearing a friendly voice.”

In just a few pages, it’s easy to see which dog has the better life – and how animal shelters strive every day to help unlucky pets find the families and love they deserve.

“Every child knows that fairy tales have to have a happy ending and in this case, young readers all too clearly can see that when it comes to the destiny of companion animals, it is in their power to be super heroes and to make sure that all dogs everywhere end up lucky and loved,” says Michael E. Kaufmann, Director, Green Chimneys Farm and Wildlife Center in Brewster, New York.
